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TEACHING NARRATIVE

My overall focus in teaching has been on strengthening the quality and opportunities for pre-licensure BSN students to have meaningful, engaging learning experiences in the areas of community health, public health nursing, population health, primary care, interprofessional (IPE) collaboration and prevention-oriented evidence-based practice. Informed by my study and training in experiential approaches to public health nursing and global health education, I have developed revisions and innovations within my didactic and clinical courses to enhance student engagement in community and population-focused local and regional settings. These include experiences with the student-led interprofessional clinic at Albuquerque Heading Home AOC shelter for men experiencing homelessness, a rural health clinical practicum with the Chinle Service Unit (CSU) Public Health Nursing (PHN) Department in the Navajo Nation, the Primary Care TeleECHO clinic, the Storehouse Food Pantry, the African Refugee Women's Group in Albuquerque, Cultural Humility Education with the HSC Center for Native American Health, and outreach with the Mexican Consulate in Albuquerque. One impact of the COVID pandemic has been a marked limitation of face-to-face clinical opportunities for BSN students. I have collaborated closely with my colleague LeeAnna Vargas to strengthen our partnerships with the HSC Office Of Community Health (OCH) and the New Mexico Department of Health (DOH). We designed several new experiences for our L 4 and 5 students in 2020 - 2021 to be able to obtain clinical experience working with a variety of populations and communities.

In collaboration with the Chinle Service Unit (CSU) PHN Department (Navajo Nation) and the Community Outreach and Patient Empowerment (COPE) Program (Gallup, NM), all Level 5 students (Spring 2021) obtained their Certificate in Contact Tracing from John's Hopkin's University and have been working with PHN-led teams from CSU to provide Virtual Contact Tracing (VCT) services for Navajo individuals served by the Chinle Service Unit.

Another curricular enhancement involves the IPE Social Determinants of Health learning activity that is embedded in my Health Care Participant Course for Level 2 students. Whereas in previous years this has been a face-to-face activity with Nursing, Physical Therapy and Occupational Therapy students, in 2021 we revised this and delivered an online version that was very well-received by the students.

Curricular development and innovation for Level 4 students includes the development and clinical oversight for the following:

- 1) Partnership with the HSC Office of Community Health (OCH) and the NM Department of Aging and Long Term Services (ALTS). Students participated in the Care Calls Initiative, and made scripted telephone outreach calls to older adults and individuals with disabilities throughout New Mexico, to assess, connect with services, and document their eligibility for community benefit services under the Centennial Care Waiver Program. Since February 2021, this activity has shifted to the priority of securing COVID vaccination appointments for this population in collaboration with the NM DOH and the HSC OCH.

- 2) Partnership with UNM Student Health and Counseling Center (SHAC) and clinical oversight. Level 4 students are obtaining clinical experience by conducting outreach and screening calls to UNM students who have screened positive for COVID-like symptoms on their daily attestations.

Finally, working with Dr. Judy Liesveld and our NMNEC partners, we are launching the first annual statewide NMNEC Disaster Preparedness Education Event on April 9, 2021. Level 2

students from UNM Albuquerque, UNM Valencia and UNM Farmington campuses will participate together in a facilitated interactive virtual learning experience.
